



Neutering your dog or cat

It does cost money to neuter a dog or cat but if you weigh up the cost of that against the cost of raising a litter of unwanted pups or kittens (someone has to feed them and find them homes, not that easy) or other hidden costs, then it will not seem much. Ask about financial neutering offers. Dogs and cats do not get fat and lazy as a result of neutering, they get fat and lazy because they are being fed too much or not being exercised enough. A working dog will work just as well (when it's had time to recover) after it has been neutered. The only reason a working dog will not work is, if it is injured or hasn't been trained or treated properly. What's "natural" in this world is not relevant anymore. Very little is natural anymore. We live in changed times and there is no space for dogs and cats to roam around and breed freely like they used to. There are laws against it now and heavy fines. Pedigree dogs need to be neutered the same as any other dog. They break out, breed (creating mongrel pups) and cause havoc just like any other dog, regardless of what they cost. "Pedigree dogs with papers" means nothing if they are not up to breed standard... and very few are, If you are not an actual "breeder" that shows your dogs (they need

to be getting 1^{st prize} 2nd prize or 3^{rd prize} regularly) then please don't breed. "Once **breeding"** only gives an animal a taste for

neuter.

something it won't be allowed to repeat (unfair), it is just using a dog as an extra income and will also most likely bring down the standard of the breed as a result. Not neutering your dog or cat can cause overpopulation (the dog pound never empties), cruelty, aggression problems, unruly behaviour, diseases, and car accidents... to name but a few. Do the right thing, please

Kegite Club 1st. Anniversary


