





"I joined Letterkenny C.D.P. to meet my neighbours as I was new to Letterkenny and found it hard to meet people. It was a great way to get involved in what was going on in my area and it is so much fun. I have made many new friends". (New resident, female) "Before I joined Letterkenny C.D.P. I had no confidence and was very lonely. I got involved in my Resident's Association and then the C.D.P. The whole team are great and they really help you to get involved ". (Young Mother) "I took my children on the Summer Scheme 4 years ago and they had a ball. We go every year and they talk about it for months. It is great fun, and costs so little money I can afford to take my four children for the full week". (Lone Parent) "I don't have much time to spare in my work-life but I joined Letterkenny C.D.P. to stay involved in my community and give time to others. I like the way they do their meetings on a monthly basis never lasting more than an hour or so ". (Self-employed, Male)

"Before Letterkenny C.D.P. helped us to set up our Resident's Association we had a lot of problems in our estate; but with their help we were able to organise things like Neighbourhood Watch, regular Clean-Ups and fun activities for the children. Anyone thinking of joining should just get involved and see what they can do for themselves".

"Ilike the Summer Schemes because we get to go on bus trips to Waterworld and Greencastle. I made a lot of new friends and play with them at school as well". (Child aged 7) "The best thing is the Drama and the Carnival Band, and I didn't have to know any music before
