

The Boston Experience: In July of this year I was given the opportunity to visit Boston U.S.A. as part of a team carrying out a feasibility study on a proposal for an I.F.I. Wider Horizons Programme titled "Estate Management Programme". The lead of promoter this programme **Tyrone** is Donegal Partnership TUATH, supported by Omagh Community House and the Irish Immigration Centre, Boston. Expected outputs of this programme are to collate studies and community audits of social problems possible and solutions, through practical links with Boston and other projects in Tyrone and Donegal and to develop an agreed I.F.I. Horizons Programme model of training and accreditation which could used in future community -based development. On arrival in Boston we were met by the very energetic Lena Deevy who, with the support of her excellent staff, had organised visits to numerous voluntary and statutory groups who work in highly disadvantaged areas of Boston. 





