



the beginning of millennium, spectacular evolved naturally in Ireland changing the course of history, the scope of reasoning of the Irish citizens and affirming the connotation of the world being a global village. Truly, the occurrence was the migration

It is a common knowledge that the skill of reading and writing (literacy education) evolved foremost in Africa, (Egypt). Yet the advancement of same is reflecting more in Europe and other Continents because of partially African attitudes to adventure and other numerous factors pretty difficult to mention. However, the call for caution now is not about the retrogressively developing African nations but to sound the alarming wake up calls to our over pampering, vulnerable youths about the conventional basic education and the falling standards. The tagging of some basic educational ethics as 'old fashioned', the negative impacts of information technology, children 's rights and law, are all technically leading the pace of true development aback. I believe and do say that "there is nothing like rights but what the law allows". The practice of rote-learning will also aid our children in developing their spelling abilities and as well disabuse the text messaging language now affecting student's English grammar and composition. (Spare me examination results stuff please!!!). I am not an alarmist. As the holidays are over and schools back in sessions, it will be my desire to enjoin parents to fight the common enemy, which is ignorance. Without being judgemental, I maintain to say that it will be an act of gross irresponsibility for parents to leave their children outside the home at very odd hours (12 midnight till early morning) playing while the parents are indoors watching telly over some glasses or giving little attention to other emotional demands at the expense of their children's welfare and safety.

Africans tend to forget hatred easily because they have to reconcile themselves to life if one finds oneself totally emasculated by circumstance, what one does is to find a convenient way of continuing ones existence. They remember only that which is convenient for them to remember and forget the others. Showing gratitude is African, any African who does not know how to say 'thank you' is a nonentity and such a person should not be counted amongst, in the scheme of
